## CITY OF CROWLEY REGULAR MEETING SEPTEMBER 9<sup>TH</sup>, 2020

The Mayor Pro Tem and Board of Aldermen of the City of Crowley, Louisiana, the governing authority of the City of Crowley, met in a regular session at 6:00 p.m. Wednesday the 9<sup>th</sup> day of September 2020 at the regular meeting place of said Mayor and Board of Aldermen, the Council Chambers, 426 North Avenue F, Crowley, Louisiana.

Mayor Pro Temp Steven Premeaux presided with the following Aldermen present: Jeff Cavell, Thompson Bradford Core, Clint Cradeur, Lyle Fogleman, Jr., Vernon Martin, Samuel J. Reggie, III, Kim Stringfellow, and Byron K. Wilridge.

Alderman Byron K. Wilridge led the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag. Alderman Brad Core gave the invocation.

#### **PUBLIC HEARING:**

Mayor Pro Temp Steven Premeaux opened the public hearing on proposed ordinance no. 1510, the ordinance was read by title as follows:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND REACT SECTION 3.14 OF ARTICLE III OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CROWLEY BY REPEALING SUBSECTION 3.1407, PROHIBITED USES, OF THE SPECIAL GATEWAY OVERLAY DISTRICTS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE PROVISIONS HEREOF TO BE SEVERABLE; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES INCONSISTEN THERETO OR IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; AND TO PROVIDE FOR ALL OTHER MATTERS RELATIVE THEERETO.

Mr. Steven Premeaux asked for proponents to the proposed ordinance no. 1510. Chris Heuser's spoke in favor of the ordinance. A third and final call was made with no one else coming forward to speak. The call for opponents of the proposed ordinance no. 1510 was made with no one coming forward to speak. No other comments were made after the third and final call. Steven Premeaux called the public hearing on ordinance no. 1510 to a close.

## **AGENDA AMENDMENTS:**

Alderman Lyle Fogleman offered the motion to amend the agenda and seconded by Alderman Vernon Martin to authorize the submittal of the FY'2021-2022 State of Louisiana Capital Outlay Request for Public Sewerage System Expansion Along North of I-10 Service Road, Restoration and Rehabilitation of Rice Community Theatre, Renovations and Repairs to the Rice Festival Building, Ultraviolet Disinfection System Improvements at the City of Crowley's Wastewater Treatment Facility, Installation of Comminutor at the City of Crowley's Main Sewerage Pump Station, City of Crowley Pavilion and RV Campground for the City of Crowley Recreation Center. Motion carried unanimously.

# **APPEARANCES:**

Don Landry appeared to announce his candidacy for District Attorney and asked for the council to consider him on election day.

#### **READING & APPROVAL OF MINUTES:**

Alderman Vernon Martin moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the August 12<sup>th</sup>, 2020 council meeting, August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2020 Special Council Meeting, and the August 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2020 Special Council Meeting seconded by Alderman Byron Wilridge and duly adopted.

#### **MAYOR'S REPORTS:**

Mayor presented the Sales Tax chart and User Fee chart that track the collection trend.

Mayor presented the monthly budget-to-actual comparisons that report the spending of major funds.

#### **PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE:**

Chairperson – Alderman Clint Cradeur Vice-Chairperson – Alderman Brad Core Members – Aldermen Byron Wilridge, Lyle Fogleman, Jr. and Vernon Martin

A motion was offered by Alderman Clint Cradeur and seconded by Alderman Jeff Cavell to approve Partial Payment Estimate No. 3 to Southern Constructors, Inc. for the City-Wide Drainage Improvements Project in the amount of \$266,931.01. Motion carried.

A motion was offered by Alderman Clint Cradeur and seconded by Alderman Byron Wilridge to approve Change Order No. 2 in the amount of \$42,504.60 under the Southern Constructors, Inc. contract for the City-Wide Drainage Improvements Project to extend drainage improvements along the south side of First Street between the outfall ditch near Avenue N and the Acadia Council on Aging office. Motion carried.

A motion was offered by Alderman Clint Cradeur and seconded by Alderman Lyle Fogleman to approve Change Order No. 3 in the amount of \$24,083.00 under the Southern Constructors, Inc. contract for the City-Wide Drainage Improvements Project to complete the replacement of a manhole and street inlet and installation of a sanitary sewer main conflict box at the intersection of Avenue G and First Street. Motion carried.

A motion was offered by Alderman Clint Cradeur and seconded by Alderman Lyle Fogleman to authorize Mader Engineering, Inc. to prepare the plans and specifications for "City Parking Lot Improvements," as noted on Exhibit #1: Pre-Turf Project Estimates, and Exhibit #2: Post-Turf Project Estimates. Motion carried with Alderwoman Kim Stringfellow voting against.

#### **UTILITY COMMITTEE:**

Chairperson – Alderman Vernon Martin Vice-Chairperson – Alderman Sammy Reggie Members – Aldermen Jeff Cavell, Lyle Fogleman, Jr., and Clint Cradeur

A motion was offered by Alderman Sammy Reggie and seconded by Alderman Jeff Cavell for an ordinance be introduced by resolution to change the current sewer user fee formula based on the August 17<sup>th</sup>, 2020 certification provided to Council; and, with said resolution also include a provision that would exempt the Acadia Parish Detention Center from having to pay the sewer user fee rates for customers located outside the city limits. Motions failed with a 2-6 vote with Aldermen Jeff Cavell and Lyle Fogleman voting for and Aldermen Brad Core, Clint Cradeur, Vernon Martin, Sammy Reggie, Kim Stringfellow and Byron Wilridge voting against.

#### **RECREATION COMMITTEE:**

Chairperson – Alderman Steven Premeaux Vice-Chairperson – Alderman Clint Cradeur Members – Aldermen Jeff Cavell., Sammy Reggie and Lyle Fogleman

A motion was made by Alderman Clint Cradeur and seconded by Alderman Vernon Martin to award a Base Bid, for the renovations and repairs to the Rice Festival Building, in the amount of \$249,000.00 and Alternate Proposal No. 1 (\$5,900.00) for the office expansion, for a total of \$254,900.00, to E. L. Habetz Builders, Inc.; to authorize Change Order No. 1 to reduce the allowance for the Sound System item of work from \$25,000.00 to \$20,000.00; and all contingent upon review and approval of Facility Planning and Control and upon the recommendation made by architect Joshua Hoffpauir and concurred with by City Attorney Tom Regan after his review of the bids and the withdrawal by the apparent low bidder. Motion carried.

#### **RESOLUTIONS:**

The following resolution was offered by Alderman Clint Cradeur and seconded by Alderman Jeff Cavell, and duly resolved and adopted with Alderwoman Kim Stringfellow voting against.

A RESOLUTION OF CONFIRMING AND RE-AUTHORIZING THE MARCH 11, 2020, RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF CROWLEY, LOUISIANA, TO INCUR DEBT AND TO BORROW FROM THE LOCAL **GOVERNMENT ENVIRONMENTAL LOUISIANA** FACILITIES AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$20,000,000. FOR THE PURPOSE OF COST ENGINEERING, CONSTRUCTION, FINANCING OF ADDITIONS, ACQUISITIONS, REPAIRS AND/OR EXPANSIONS NEEDED FOR CITY WIDE STREET IMPROVEMENTS INCLUDING DRAINAGE; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTIN WITH THE FOREGOING.

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the Board of Aldermen (the "Council"), governing authority of the City of Crowley, Louisiana (the "City"), adopted a resolution authorizing (the "Authorizing Resolution") the City to incur debt and to borrow from the Louisiana Local Government Environmental Facilities and Community Development Authority (the "Authority") an amount not to exceed \$20,000,000 to mature not later than 20 years from date of issuance, in one or more series, at a rate or rates not exceeding 7.00% per annum (the "Bonds"), for the purpose of financing the cost of engineering, construction, additions, acquisitions, repairs, and/or expansions needed for city-wide street improvements, including drainage, and to pay the costs of issuance of the Bonds, including the premiums for a bond insurance policy and a debt service reserve fund surety policy, if necessary (the "Project"), and providing for other matters in connection with the foregoing;

WHEREAS, upon adoption of the Authorizing Resolution, the City's Administration and the City's employed finance team acknowledged and agreed to return to the City's Council to report developments related to issuance, sale and delivery of the City's Bonds;

WHEREAS, since the adoption of the Authorizing Resolution the world-wide pandemic associated with COVID-19, a respiratory illness caused by a novel strain of the coronavirus ("COVID-19"), has caused confusion and uncertainty of the Municipal Bond Market;

WHEREAS, after reviewing the current trends of the Municipal Bond Market and the City's present financial condition, the City's Administration and the City's finance team believes it to be in the best interest of the City to proceed with the issuance of the Bonds in two (2) separate series, in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$20,000,000, for the purpose of financing the Project;

WHEREAS, it is proposed by the City's Administration and the City's finance team that the first series of Bonds, in an amount not to exceed \$14,000,000 be issued to fund a portion of the Project, which is expected to be marketed and sold in October, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Confirming Resolution is to provide information to the Council, as agreed on March 11, 2020, and to confirm and re-authorize the actions of the Council contained in the Authorizing Resolution,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL, in regular session convened, that:

- <u>SECTION 1.</u> The statements of fact expressly contained within the preamble to this Resolution have been specifically reviewed by the Council and are found to be factually true and correct, and are made resolutions of the City.
- <u>SECTION 2.</u> The Council does hereby confirm and re-authorize all facts, circumstances and actions contained and described in the Authorizing Resolution adopted by the Council on March 11, 2020, in their entirety.
- SECTION 3. The Council further agrees and authorizes issuance of the City's Bonds in two (2) series, the first in an amount not to exceed \$14,000,000, for purposes of financing a portion of the Project, said Bonds to be secured by and payable from Lawfully Available Funds of the City.
- SECTION 4. This Council does hereby approve execution of the Loan Agreement with the Authority substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A. The Mayor, Mayor Pro-Tem and/or City Clerk of the City be and they are hereby authorized and directed to execute said Loan Agreement for and on behalf of the City and are further authorized to make and approve any changes required therein, but not inconsistent with the intent of this Confirming Resolution, or as may be required by the City Attorney or Bond Counsel.
- SECTION 5. The City covenants and agrees that, to the extent permitted by the laws of the State of Louisiana, it will comply with the requirements of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") in order to establish, maintain and preserve the exclusion from "gross income" of interest on the Bonds under the Code. The City further covenants and agrees it will not take any action, fail to take any action, or permit any action within its control to be taken, or permit at any time or times any of the proceeds of the Bonds or any other funds of the City to be used directly or indirectly in any manner, the effect of which would be to cause the Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" or would result in the inclusion of interest on any of the Bonds in gross income under the Code, including, without limitation, (i) the failure to comply with the limitation on investment of Bond proceeds or (ii) the failure to pay any required rebate of arbitrage earnings to the United States of America or (iii) the use of proceeds of the Bonds in a manner which would cause the Bonds to be "private activity bonds."
- SECTION 6. The Mayor, Mayor Pro-Tem and/or City Clerk of the City be and they are hereby authorized to take and perform any and all actions required and necessary under the terms of the Loan Agreement, the Bond Purchase Agreement, including execution of certificates and other documents necessary therefor. The Mayor, Mayor Pro-Tem and/or Clerk of the City are hereby further empowered, authorized and directed to take any and all action and to execute and deliver any instrument, document or certificate necessary to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution.
- <u>SECTION 7.</u> All resolutions, ordinances or orders in conflict herewith, be to the extent of such conflict, and they are hereby repealed.
- THUS DONE AND ADOPTED during the regular meeting held in regular session duly convened on the 9<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2020, in Crowley, Acadia Parish, Louisiana, at which a quorum was present and acting throughout.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 1510**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND REACT SECTION 3.14 OF ARTICLE III OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CROWLEY BY REPEALING SUBSECTION 3.1407, PROHIBITED USES, OF THE SPECIAL GATEWAY OVERLAY DISTRICTS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE PROVISIONS HEREOF TO BE SEVERABLE; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES INCONSISTEN THERETO OR IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; AND TO PROVIDE FOR ALL OTHER MATTERS RELATIVE THEERETO.

WHEREAS, the Special Gateway Overlay District Ordinance limits the use and availability of property in the main entry corridors of the City of Crowley by prohibiting certain uses and imposing restrictions, limitations and requirements on property owners wishing to remodel building recently used for occupations and businesses that are prohibited and imposes strict requirements for facades, parking lots, green spaces and driveways; and

WHEREAS, although many citizens are in support of and wish to continue the limitations of the Gateway Overlay District Ordnance in order to enhance the facades, parking lots, green spaces and driveways along the main thoroughfares of the City of Crowley, some property owners within the overlay districts have complained the effects of the ordinance have denied them use of their property; and

WHEREAS, it is evidence that a significant improvement has occurred in the appearance and esthetic quality of traffic design and flow and of new construction and remodeled buildings since the adoption of the Gateway Overlay District Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen find the requirements, restrictions and limitations of the Gateway Overlay District Ordinance have a significant value and have accomplished the purposes for which it was originally intended; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen also find the prohibited uses are to broad and restrictive and that the prohibited used could be repealed leaving in tact the remained of the requirements, restrictions and limitations of the Gateway Overlay District Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance was duly introduced and notice of this ordinance and of the public hearing having been published; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing having been held in accordance with law on the 9<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2020, at 6:00 o'clock p.m. at Council Chambers in the Criminal Justice Building, Crowley, Louisiana;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF CROWLEY, ACADIA PARISH, LOUISIANA, IN REGULAR SESSION DULY CONVENED THAT:

SECTION 1: Section 3.14 of Article III of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Crowley be and the same is hereby amended and re-enacted by repealing Subsection 3.1407, Prohibited Uses, in its entirety, and renumbering the remaining subsections therein.

SECTION 2: If any provision, part, word, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance and do hereby declare the provisions hereof to be severable, then in that event, only that particular provision, part, word, section,

subsection, sentence, clause or phrase shall be deemed unconstitutional or invalid and the remaining provisions, parts, words, sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases will not be affected and shall continue in full force and effect.

SECTION 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
