CITY OF CROWLEY REGULAR MEETING NOVEMBER 10, 2021

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Crowley, Louisiana, the governing authority of the City of Crowley, met in a regular session at 6:00 p.m. Wednesday the 10th day of November 2021 at the regular meeting place of said Mayor and Board of Aldermen, the Council Chambers, 426 North Avenue F, Crowley, Louisiana.

Mayor Tim Monceaux presided with the following Aldermen present: Jeff Cavell, Thompson Bradford Core, Clint Cradeur, Lyle Fogleman, Jr., Vernon Martin, Steven Premeaux, Samuel J. Reggie, III, Bryon K. Wilridge and Kim Stringfellow.

None were absent.

Alderwoman Kim Stringfellow led the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag. Alderman Bryon K. Wilridge gave the invocation.

APPEARANCES:

Mr. Tim Mader gave an update on behalf of Ms. Emily Stoma, Citizens Against Blight provided an update to the Council on the blighted properties in Crowley.

PUBLIC HEARINGS:

Mayor Tim Monceaux opened the Public Hearing on the Rule to Show Cause for the condemnation of property by the City of Crowley belonging to the unopened successions of Kenneth W. Corumia and Edwina Wilridge Corumia for the property situated on Lot 10 of Block 4 of Walker Addition to the City of Crowley bearing a municipal address of 316 Spann Avenue, Crowley, Louisiana. City Attorney Tom Regan stated that they had received a text message from Mr. Howie who has been appointed to represent the unopened successions. He mentioned that he had been detained. Mr. Regan asked Alderman Core to request a resolution to reset the matter for December 8, 2021 so that new notices did not have to be issued. A motion was offered by Alderman Brad Core and seconded by Alderman Vernon Martin to reset the public hearing for December 8, 2021. There being no remarks from the Council. The motion having been submitted to a voice vote; the motion carried unanimously.

City Attorney Tom Regan opened the public hearing on proposed Ordinance No. 1527, the Ordinance was read by title as follows:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND RE-ENACT SECTION 14-23(c) OF ARTICLE II OF CHAPTER 14 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CROWLEY, ACADIA PARISH, LOUISIANA, TO DESIGNATE EAST THIRD STREET AND NORTH AVENUE I, EAST THIRD STREET AND NORTH AVENUE J, EAST FOURTH STREET AND NORTH AVENUE I AND EAST FOURTH STREET AND **AVENUE** J AS **FOUR** (4)WAY INTERSECTIONS; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES CONTRARY THERETO OR IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; AND TO PROVIDE FOR ALL MATTERS RELATIVE THERETO.

City Attorney Tom Regan asked for proponents to the proposed ordinance no. 1527. A third and final call was made with no one coming forward to speak. The call for opponents of the proposed ordinance no. 1527 was made. Mr. Chris Huesers suggested that there were other options to consider rather than another four-way stop sign. A third and final call was made with no one coming forward to speak. Mr. Regan moved that the clerk place a recorded copy (Exhibit A) of the recommendation presented to the Council by the Chief of Police as part of the official transcript. City Attorney Tom Regan called the public hearing on ordinance no. 1527 to a close and reconvened the regular Council meeting.

Alderman Jeff Cavel moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the October 13, 2021, Regular Council meeting seconded by Alderman Brad Core and duly adopted. Alderman Byron Wilridge moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the October 19, 2021, Special Council meeting seconded by Alderman Brad Core and duly adopted.

MAYOR'S REPORTS:

Mayor presented the Sales Tax chart and User Fee chart that track the collection trend.

Mayor presented the monthly budget-to-actual comparisons that report the spending of major funds.

PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE:

A motion was offered by Alderman Clint Cradeur and seconded by Alderman Vernon Martin to approve Partial Payment Estimate No. 16 to Southern Constructors, Inc. for the City-Wide Drainage Improvements Project in the amount of \$71,297.06. Mayor Monceaux opened the floor for discussion. There being no remarks from the Council. The motion having been submitted to a voice vote; the motion carried unanimously.

A motion was offered by Alderman Clint Cradeur and seconded by Alderman Bryon Wilridge to adopt the Resolution for the approval of the plans and specifications and authorizing the advertisement for bids for the following project: 2021 City-Wide Street Improvements (Contract B). Mayor Monceaux opened the floor for discussion. There being no remarks from the Council. The motion having been submitted to a voice vote; the resolution carried unanimously.

Mayor Monceaux opened the floor for discussion. There being no remarks from the Council. The motion having been submitted to a voice vote; the motion carried unanimously.

A motion was offered by Alderman Clint Cradeur and seconded by Alderman Bryon Wilridge to approve Partial Payment Estimate No. 8 to Triton Construction, LLC for the City-

Owned Parking Lot Improvements Project in an amount of \$115,149.26. Mayor Monceaux opened the floor for discussion. There being no remarks from the Council. The motion having been submitted to a voice vote; the motion carried unanimously.

UTILITY COMMITTEE:

A motion was offered by Alderman Vernon Martin and seconded by Alderman Jeff Cavell to adopt a Resolution approving the plans and specifications and authorizing the advertisement for bids for the following project: Rehabilitation of the Sewerage Collection System. Mayor Monceaux opened the floor for discussion. There being no remarks from the Council. The motion having been submitted to a voice vote; the resolution carried unanimously.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS AND AUTHORIZING THE ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS FOR THE FOLLOWING PROJECT: REHABILITATION OF THE SEWERAGE COLLECTION SYSTEM

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Crowley that the Plans and Specifications for the project, "**REHABILITATION OF THE SEWERAGE COLLECTION SYSTEM**", prepared by Mader Engineering, Inc., are hereby approved and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Advertisement For Bids for said project is hereby authorized; that bids shall be received in accordance with the requirements of the Louisiana Uniform Public Works Bid Laws, at which time the bids will be publicly opened; and that said time shall be established and may be amended in accordance with said Public Bid Law.

THUS DONE AND ADOPTED in regular session convened on the 10th day of November, 2021, in Crowley, Acadia Parish, Louisiana, at which a quorum was present and acting throughout.

ZONING & ANNEXACTION COMMITTEE:

A motion was offered by Alderman Lyle Fogleman and seconded by Alderman Jeff Cavell to table the consideration the favorable recommendation of the Crowley Planning Commission for variance of Ordinance 7.701 for Bass LTD to erect one (1) digital billboard at the SW corner of Highway 1111 & Oddfellows Road. Said digital billboard not to exceed 12' x 24' in size, and to be located outside of the control area greater than 300 feet from Interstate Hwy. 10. Discussion ensued and Chairman Fogleman stated, in the opinion provided by the City Attorney Tom Regan, neither the Crowley Planning Commission nor the Council has authority to approve a billboard variance in this area of the City, as the location is controlled by the Gateway Overlay Ordinance, and the ordinance does not provide for a process to obtain a variance. Mayor Monceaux opened the floor for discussion. Alderman Clint Credeur questioned if tabling the action is the correct way to handle this motion. Mr. Regan stated that it was his committee report, since the procedure is not allowed by the Gateway Ordinance which does not allow for a variance, the application should have never been accepted. He recommended that the motion cancel the application and return it to the applicant. Mayor Monceaux verified that the City has cancelled the application and returned it to the applicant. Mr. Regan further explained that any future applications requesting a variance should be denied by the Code Enforcement. Alderman Lyle Fogleman offered a substitute motion seconded by Alderman Samuel Reggie to reject the application; refund the application fee and this council does not act on this item. Mayor Monceaux opened the floor for discussion. Alderman Vernon Martin explained that there were no such things as digital billboards when the Gateway Overlay ordinance was adopted, and any ordinance adopted by the Council can be amended. Alderwoman Kim Stringfellow questioned if the applicant had received their refund. Mayor Monceaux stated the applicant refused the refund, so it is being mailed. There being no remarks from the Council. The motion having been submitted to a voice vote; Alderman Brad Core abstained; the motion carried.

A motion was offered by Alderman Brad Core and seconded by Alderman Steven Premeaux to approve the favorable recommendation of the City of Crowley Planning Commission of the resubdivide of property as shown on Preliminary & Final Plat of Survey showing property to be subdivided by J. D. Gielen & Family LLC, being a 5.801-acre tract of land divided into Tract A and Tract B situated in Section 29, T9S, R1E, Acadia Parish, LA, prepared by A Hebert Land Surveying LLC, dated September 28, 2021. Mayor Monceaux opened the floor for discussion. There being no

remarks from the Council. The motion having been submitted to a voice vote; Alderman Lyle Fogleman abstained; the motion carried.

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE:

A motion was offered by Alderman Brad Core and seconded by Jeff Cavell to adopt a resolution for the Council to consider a motion to rescind all previously approved Class A and Class B alcoholic beverage permits for the year 2022 pending further review. Mayor Monceaux opened the floor for discussion. There being no remarks from the Council. The motion having been submitted to a voice vote; Alderman Samuel Reggie abstained; the motion carried.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all Class A and Class B licenses previously approved were provided temporary receipts for later issuance of the official numbered license/permit for the calendar year 2022 are subject to the review process and the numbered license/permit will not be issued until the application has been subsequently approved.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND RE-ENACT SECTION 2-6 OF CHAPTER 2 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CROWLEY TO REDEFINE THE BOUNDARIES OF THE FOUR (4) WARDS OF THE CITY OF CROWLEY WHICH ARE ALSO DESIGNATED AS THE VOTING DISTRICTS FOR THE DUAL SINGLE MEMBER VOTING DISTRICTS OF THE CITY OF CROWLEY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE POPULATION ESTABLISHED BY THE 2020 DECENNIAL CENSUS OF THE US CENSUS BUREAU; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES CONTRARY THERETO OR IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; AND TO PROVIDE FOR ALL MATTERS RELATIVE THERETO.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen that the City Clerk shall publish the following notice in the Crowley Post Signal:

NOTICE OF PROPOSED ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE AND PUBLIC HEARING

The Board of Aldermen of the City of Crowley shall meet on the 8th day of December, 2021, at 6:00 o'clock p.m. in the Council Chambers, 2nd Floor, Criminal Justice Building, 426 North Avenue F, Crowley, Louisiana, to consider the adoption of the following ordinance:

Copies of the proposed ordinance are available for a nominal fee in the office of the City Clerk, City Hall, Crowley, Louisiana.

THUS DONE AND SIGNED on this the 10th day of November, 2021.

A motion was made by Alderman Steven Premeaux and seconded by Alderman Lyle Fogleman to adopt a resolution authorizing the City of Crowley to join with the State of Louisiana as a participant in the Louisiana State Local Government Opioid Litigation Memorandum of Understanding which includes participation in the settlement agreement and authorizing Messrs Laborde or Earles to execute the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). Mayor Monceaux opened the floor for discussion. Alderwoman Kim Stringfellow asked for clarification of the resolution. City Attorney Mr. Tom Regan stated that Ms. Madeline Brumley from LaBorde Earles firm was here to answer questions. Mr. Regan stated that it's a recommendation from the La AG and Governor's office. They combined to file action for the state of Louisiana instead of individually, separate from the class action suit filed against the distributors in Federal court in Ohio. It is on behalf of all political subdivisions of the state of Louisiana. The Attorney General's office hired LaBorde Earles to negotiate the settlement agreement. The main thing is that the city of Crowley is becoming a participant in recommending that Louisiana receive the amount of the settlement that is proportionately divided by population, rejection by one political entity or failure to act on it reduces the settlement amount the state of Louisiana will receive. Ms. Brumley stated her firm and many others filed litigation in 2017 against manufacturers and distributors of Opioid medication for their role in the Opioid crisis. She stated that many years later they have negotiated a settlement that would include \$22.8 billion paid out nationally over the next 18 years. She further explained that the state's share(s) is based on a computation including population and the number of opioid cases and that Louisiana's share would be approximately \$350 million dollars. She stated that by adopting the resolution the City of Crowley would be agreeing to participate to allow Louisiana to get the full portion of the settlement that is based on the population and failure to act or rejection reducing the amount of the settlement. Ms. Madeline Brumley, explained that the Attorney General for the State of Louisiana agreed to turn over 100% of the state's local governments with a 20% carve out for parish sheriffs. The resolution would 1) the City of Crowley is agreeing to promise to not join in the litigation and that the city would accept the settlement and the City will not sue the defendants in the

future for these activities. 2) give partners of LaBorde Earles law firm authority to sign the Attorney Generals Memorandum of Understanding on behalf of the City of Crowley 3) give the Mayor the authority to sign the settlement documents 4) gives the Attorney General to settle other opioid claims on the city's behalf. She further explained that 45% of the money states share is based on incentive payments. If one litigating entity or political subdivision with 10,000 constituents, does not participate, then the states share goes from 100% to 70%. Failure to pass this resolution will cost the state of Louisiana approximately \$100 million dollars over 18 years. She explained that the sooner the resolution was voted on the sooner they could continue to pursue other political subdivisions and litigating entities. Alderman Brad Core questioned when the city was notified of the resolution. Mr. Regan explained that this was within this week. Ms. Brumley explained that the latest the city could adopt the resolution would be the December 8th regular council meeting in order for documents to the signed and processed before January 1, 2022. Alderman Clint Cradeur questioned who would be monitoring the spending of the funds in the future. Ms. Brumley explained that it would be held in a trust with the State and that it would be an application and reimbursement process. If the City of Crowley decides to do nothing with the trust, the funds would go into the state of Louisiana's General fund after 20 years. Alderman Brad Core reaffirmed that he would prefer to read documents before signing them and asked if the next council meeting would give enough time to get the paperwork processed.

A motion was made by Alderman Brad Core and seconded by Alderwoman Kim Stringfellow to amend the adoption and postpone it until the next Council meeting. Mayor Monceaux opened the floor for discussion. There being no further remarks from the Council. The motion having been submitted to a vote by show of hands; for amendment failed by a vote of 3 yeas and 6 nays. Mayor Monceaux then read the original motion. A motion was made by Alderman Lyle Fogleman and seconded by Alderman Steven Premeaux to adopt the resolution. The original motion having been submitted to a vote by a show of hands; the resolution carried by a vote of 6 yeas and 2 nays.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF CROWLEY AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO JOIN WITH THE STATE OF LOUISIANA AND OTHER LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL UNITS AS A PARTICIPANT IN THE LOUISIANA STATE-LOCAL **GOVERNMENT OPIOID** LITIGATION MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (THE "MOU"); AUTHORIZING THE ATTORNEYS TO EXECUTE THE MOU; AUTHORIZING MAYOR TO EXECUTE ANY SUBSEQUENT FORMAL AGREEMENTS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE MOU, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE SUBDIVISION SETTLEMENT PARTICIPATION FORM(S) IN **EXHIBIT** DISTRIBUTOR SETTEMENT AGREEMENT AND THE JANSSEN SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT;; AND TO PROVIDE FOR ALL MATTERS RELATIVE THERETO AND IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

WHEREAS, the City of Crowley has suffered harm from the opioid epidemic and recognizes that the entire State of Louisiana has suffered harm from the opioid epidemic; and

WHEREAS, the State of Louisiana has a pending action in State Court and a number of Louisiana cities and parishes have also filed an action *In Re: National Prescription Opiate Litigation*, MDL No. 2804 (N.D. Ohio) (the "Opioid Litigation"); and

WHEREAS, the State of Louisiana and layers representing certain various local governments involved in the Opioid Litigation have proposed a unified plan for the allocation and use of prospective settlement dollars from opioid related litigation; and

WHEREAS, participation in the MOU by a large majority of Louisiana cities and parishes will materially increase the amount of funds to Louisiana and should improve Louisiana's relative bargaining position during additional settlement negotiations; and

WHEREAS, failure to participate in the MOU will reduce funds available to the State, the City of Crowley and every other Louisiana city and parish;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Crowley, Parish of Acadia, in regular session duly convened, that they find participation in the MOU would be in the best interest of the City of Crowley and its citizens in that such a plan ensures that almost all of the settlement funds go to abate and resolve the opioid epidemic and each and every city and parish receives funds for the harm that it has suffered; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Aldermen hereby expresses the City of Crowley's support of a unified plan for the allocation and use of opioid settlement proceeds as generally described in the MOU, attached hereto as Exhibit "A"; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Derrick G. Earles and/or David C. Laborde be and they are hereby expressly authorized to execute the MOU in substantially the form contained in Exhibit "A"; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Honorable Tim Monceaux, Mayor of the City of Crowley, is hereby authorized to execute any formal agreements implementing a unified plan for the allocation and use of opioid settlement proceeds that is not substantially inconsistent with the MOU and this Resolution, including but not limited to the Subdivision Settlement Participation Form(s) in the Distributor Settlement Agreement and the Janssen Settlement Agreement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk be and she is hereby instructed to record this Resolution in the appropriate minute book of the City of Crowley upon its adoption and to furnish a certified copy of this Resolution to Attorney General Jeff Landry c/o Bill Stiles, Post Office Box 94005, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, 70804; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

Mayor Monceaux opened the floor for the discussion. Alderman Vernon Martin asked if everyone had been notified. Alderman Brad Core read a statement to the council. Alderman Vernon Martin explained that the four-way stop is in Alderman Core's district and his constituents wanted it. Alderman Samuel Reggie questioned what makes Levi Park better then South Crowley Park or any other park within Crowley. Alderman Brad Core explained the main difference is the arterial connection to Hwy 190. Alderman Lyle Fogleman explained he's lived in the district for over 20 years and is unaware of any major incident in that area to his knowledge. Alderwoman Kim Stringfellow stated that a traffic study had been done years ago and many stop signs were removed. She asked if a new study could be done and if anyone remembered who did the original one. Alderman Steven Premeaux stated it was Mr. Dean Ketel from Lafayette. Alderman Vernon Martin stated Levi park is a hub for the city and it is more of a safety issue than the other parks. There being no further discussion from the Council.
