The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Crowley, Louisiana, the governing authority of the City of Crowley, met for a public hearing at 5:30 p.m. Thursday the 31st, day of March 2022 at the special meeting place of said Mayor and Board of Aldermen, the City Hall Council Chambers, 426 North Avenue F, Crowley, Louisiana, after the giving and posting of prior notice of public hearing in the manner provided by law.

The following agenda was read:

1) Public Hearing for the Purpose of:

The purpose of the meeting is to obtain views on the housing and community development needs of the City and a Program Amendment under the City's State of Louisiana FY 2021 Community Development Block Grant (LCDBG) Program. The following items will be discussed at the hearing:

- A. The amount of funds available for the proposed community development Rehabilitation of the Sewerage Collection System project.
- B. The range of activities available that may be undertaken, including the estimated amount of funds proposed to be used for activities that will benefit persons of low and moderate incomes;
- C. The plans of the City of Crowley for minimizing displaced persons as a result of activities assisted with such funds and the benefits to be provided by the City of Crowley to persons actually displaced as a result of such activities; and,
- D. The City's past performance on LCDBG projects funded by the State of Louisiana.

The agenda of the Public Hearing was posted at City Hall on Thursday, March 24, 2022, at 3:45 PM and the agenda was transmitted to all members of the Council and all persons requesting notice as required by law at the same time.

Mayor Tim Monceaux opened the public hearing and presided with the presence of the following Aldermen: Jeff Cavell, Thompson Bradford Core, Clint Cradeur, Samuel J. Reggie, III, Kim Stringfellow, and Vernon Martin.

Aldermen Byron Wilridge, Steven Premeaux and Lyle Fogleman were absent.

Jonas Harrington stated the low bidder for the project came in at \$1,801,130. We have \$1,600,000 available. We notified LCDBG of our bid results and the state informed us of the steps needed to request an additional 20%. The additional steps were taken and the state awarded us the additional \$201,130 needed for the construction budget, contingent upon a program amendment being completed and submitted. The public hearing was part of amendment process to include citizen participation requirements per the LCDBG program.

Mayor Tim Monceaux asked for proponents. A third and final call was made with no one coming forward to speak. The call for opponents was made. A third and final call was made with no one coming forward to speak. Mayor Tim Monceaux called the public hearing to a close.
